



HB 4032: FUELS FOR DISASTER RESPONSE

What is the Critical Energy Infrastructure [CEI] Hub?

The bulk fuel storage facility supplying virtually all of the state

- Entry point and storage for 90% of all liquid fuels in Oregon (gas, diesel, oil) + 100% of the jet fuel + 150 chemicals used by Oregon companies
- Fuels distributed daily, statewide, via tanker trucks and barges.
- Storage capacity exceeds 350 million gallons (530 Olympic-sized swimming pools) in more than 600 above-ground storage tanks
- Spans 200 acres, along a 6-mile stretch of land between the Willamette River and Hwy 30 in north Portland

Storing Oregon’s Fuels in a Single Location is Dangerous

- Earthquake. Located on unstable in-fill land (a liquefaction zone); Olympic pipeline, which delivers 70% of CEI Hub fuels, has suffered repeated leaks, and is expected to fail in the CSZ quake
- Wildland-Urban Interface Fire. Combustible & flammable fuels border Forest Park, one of the largest urban parks in the country.
- Derailment. Tracks carrying fuel, freight, and passengers run through the CEI Hub. Over 20 derailments in OR, 2022-2024.
- No Capacity to contain spills, toxic releases, or fires of CEI Hub magnitude
- No capacity to receive or distribute fuel in OR without the CEI Hub.

Oregonians Need Access to Fuels for Disaster Response

HB 4032 directs ODOE to narrow and prioritize potential sites where fuel could be stored for disaster response and recovery

❖ **Grounded in OR Energy Security Plan:** This 2024 report applied a natural hazard screen to over 4,000 potential storage sites. The result: 201 locations where bulk fuel storage *might* be viable.

❖ **Phase 2:** This bill directs ODOE to evaluate those 201 locations based on: (a) which will support population islands; (b) which will areas already identified as highest needs; (c) which are on state-owned or -managed property; (d) which are on priority transportation routes.

❖ **Action-driven:** These are the next bits of information needed to figure out if and where emergency fuel could be forward staged. More work will be needed, including local community on the narrowed list of potential sites.


